The product JUBIZOL MICRO AIR FIX is a mineral construction adhesive resp. plaster on cement base for JUBIZOL EPS External Thermal Insulation Composite Systems (ETICS).

JUBIZOL MICRO AIR FIX is made of cement and polymer binders which ensure besides good strength characteristics also extraordinary elasticity, high vapour permeability, and good adhesion on insulation slabs made of expanded polystyrene as well as on all kinds of masonry substrates.

The product is a chemical mixture for which a low content of dangerous substances is distinctive. Besides cement, the product does provably not contain any other dangerous and volatile organic compounds as well as heavy metals.
